God fearing. The four characters of Dove can be seen in the four chapters of Jonah.

1.A Child of God in his own way (Ps 55:6)

2.A Child of God in repentance (Is 38:14)

3.A Child of God in the way of God (Gen 8:8-12)

4.A Child of God in the way of discipleship (Hos 7:11)

The book starts with the sad story of going backward instead of going forward. We can see the backsliding of Jonah here. We should look backward the last years life.

1.Going away from God's presence.

This statement is seen repeatedly in chapter one. The strong enemies of Assyria were planning to attack the Israelites. Since they were wicked Jonah was not prepared to go over Nineveh. How many times we went away from fellowship by blaming others drawbacks. These type of attitudes will damage our spiritual quality individually, family wise and in Church also. Let us

examine ourselves and come back to the Lord in this New Year.

2.Away from the word of God.

When Jonah was asked to go to Nineveh, the eastern side of Gath-Hepher; Jonah went to Joppa 35 miles away to the North. If we notice we can see that he went acting himself as a Prophet. The world will not understand the hypocrisy and denial of God's command. But God is aware of it. **There are many believers and ministers in the front line who live against the word and failed in their personal, family and Church life.** Apostle Peter was in the same Joppa when he obeyed God in which he was doubtful; a dual approach to the Lord's command.

3.Away from God's will.

The word of God clearly says what we have to practise, for example:- about the salvation, baptism, worship, marriage between the believers, divorce, remarriage etc. But we come across

many problems about which there is no cut and clear doctrine. What we read in 1Cor 10:28-33 is to be decided by ourselves. The following questions should be answered by us. **(a) Is it profitable for our spiritual life? (b)Is it good for our spiritual enrichment? (c)Is it a stumbling-block for others? (d)Is it for the glory of God? (e)Is it good for the prosperity of gospel?**

If the answer is 'no' it is against the will of God. Even though Jonah has got the clear command from God to go to Nineveh which is only 550 miles east of Gath-Hepher, he travelled 2500 miles west to Tarshish (Spain) and again 35 miles towards east for his convenience. It was against the will of God. And truly he was going away from God.

We should be a comfort or solace to others through our presence, through our words through financial assistance by becoming a part of the ministry by encouraging others through our words. For this our responsibility or influence is not required. Whoever we are or what ever we are we shall be able to refresh the heart of others one way or other.

3. Do more v.21

Do more in the field to help the saints. We should commit and carry much more than what we

are expected of us in the field of evangelisation and spiritual ministries. We should be ready to give priority others needs rather than our needs.

4. Observe hospitality or keep the doors open for our believers v.22

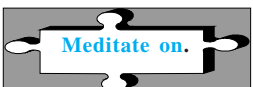

She told Mr Thomson that she was in the habit of keeping pennies in that jug. But that day she found out that was full. For her prayer to the Lord, she was told to give it to Thompson's daughter because she was praying for that. Thomson took it gladly and the girl counted it and found that it was exactly 498 pennies. What a miracle! A family which prays.

people think that there is no need to pray because they have everything with them. Some think that there is no need to pray because the Lord knows all our needs. Thomson taught his children to pray.
